Son of John Beadles of Kempston, Beds., and Elizabeth, heiress of <u>Walter Jenkins</u> of Pant, a Quaker. He married Anne Handley in 1699. He translated into Welsh the treatise by his grandfather, <u>Walter Jenkins</u>, entitled, 'The law given forth out of Zion, etc.', the translation being printed at Shrewsbury c. 1715, under the title *Y gyfraith a roddwyd allan o Sion wedi ei gyfieithu i'r Gymraeg er lleshad i bawb*.

Beadles also wrote a preface to Theodor Eccleston's replies to Thomas Andrews, vicar of Llanover, who had written about Quakers to a Pontypool parishioner. He sent an account of the beginnings of Quakerism in South Wales to the Meeting for Sufferings in London, dated 21 August 1720. He died in 1734.
