Brwynllys or ' Bronllys ' is near Talgarth. His extant work comprises much love poetry of the type which is characteristic of the followers of <u>Dafydd ap Gwilym</u>, together with a smaller number of religious and eulogistic poems including an elegy upon <u>Sir Richard Herbert</u> of Coldbrook, 1469. There are also flyting poems between him and <u>leuan Deulwyn</u> and <u>Hywel Dafi</u>. He is said to have been buried at Llanfor, but see the article on <u>Bedo Aeddren</u>.
