' Dafydd Gorlech Caermden ' according to Pen. MS. 49 (167b). Twenty-five *cywyddau* are attributed to him in the manuscripts, but eleven of these are attributed to other writers as well. Among the fourteen attributed to him alone there is a *cywydd* which begins ' Am eryr braich môr a bryn ' and contains references to <u>Sir Roger Vaughan</u>. <u>Sir Roger</u> was caught by <u>Jasper Tudor</u> in 1471 and executed at Chepstow (see *G.G.G.*, 342). The poet is old and asks for protection. Couplets in the *cywydd* beginning ' Y brud hen wyd yn bratàGu ' suggest that Dafydd Gorlech survived <u>Dafydd Llwyd ap Llywelyn ap</u> <u>Gruffydd</u>. His *cywyddau* contain references to prophecies attributed to Myrddin, <u>Taliesin</u>, and Y Bardd Glas.
