Four substantial *awdlau* by him and smaller poems of a satirical nature have been preserved in the 'Red Book of Hergest.' He sang to <u>Rhydderch ap leuan Llwyd</u> of Glyn Aeron (*fl.* 1386-97), <u>Hopkin ap Thomas</u> of Ynysdawe (*fl.* 1360-90), and Gruffudd ap Llywelyn from Uwch Aeron. <u>Moses Williams</u>'s estimate in his *Repertorium Poeticum* that he flourished about 1380 is confirmed. The above *awdlau* and the minor poems prove him to have been a resident of South Wales. One of his poems is a satire upon Rhayader (now in Radnorshire), and in an anonymous lampoon upon him in the '*Red Book*' (col. 1361) Llandovery is named.
