An elegiac *awdl* on [Owain Gwynedd](#) is attributed to him in Hendreg. MS. 21ab and [The Myvyrian Archaiology of Wales](#), 193a. The 'Red Book of Hergest,' col. 1401, attributes to him an elegy in the form of a chain of *englynion* on Gruffudd ap Cynan ab Owain Gwynedd (died 1200), which appears in Hendreg. MS. 113b and in [The Myvyrian Archaiology of Wales](#), 204b, as the work of [Llywarch ab Llywelyn](#) ('Prydydd y Moch,'). Nothing further is known of this Daniel. A striking example of the 'Titanism' which Matthew Arnold observed in Welsh poetry is to be found in the elegy on [Owain Gwynedd](#) in the lines: 'And were I able to exchange reproofs with God, I should be well supplied with material.'
