Examples of his work are to be found in *Corff y Gainc*, 1810, namely his *englyn*, 'Cyffes y Bardd 'and 'Cywydd Marwnad Rowland Huw, bardd o'r Graienyn gerllaw'r Bala, 1802.' [= Rolant Huw] *Seren Gomer* for the year 1835, 275, contains his stanzas 'Gofal Duw.' Memorial stanzas to him by <u>Gutyn Peris (GRIFFITH WILLIAMS</u>, 1769 - 1838) are contained in *Corff y Gainc*, and on his gravestone there are twelve stanzas by the same author. He is referred to on his gravestone as 'a diligent researcher,' and he is known to have been a collector of manuscripts. He died 18 February 1805 and was buried at Trawsfynydd on the 21st.
