Six sequences of his englynion are extant, two of which are to <u>Madog ap Gruffydd Maelor</u> of Powys Fadog, two to <u>Llywelyn</u> <u>ap lorwerth</u> (died 1240), and one sequence each to <u>Dafydd</u> (died 1246) and <u>Gruffydd</u>, the sons of <u>Llywelyn</u>. One of the sequences to <u>Madog</u> and one of those to <u>Llywelyn</u> are elegiac, and in each case the other sequence was addressed to the respective princes during their lifetime. The verses to <u>Dafydd</u> are intercessionary, and were therefore composed while he was alive, and those addressed to <u>Gruffydd</u> were obviously composed before his final imprisonment, and therefore before 1241.
