He was celebrated in his day because of his remarkable appearance and his unconventional method of preaching; he was responsible for the conversion of the celebrated <u>Jenkin Thomas</u> ('Siencyn Penhydd,' 1746 - 1807). He, with others, built the first Methodist chapel at Llanfynydd c. 1771. He is called ' Evan David of Tir y Clai, Cordwainer' in the will of <u>Morgan Rhys</u>, 1779 - he was one of the executors of the last will of that hymn-writer. The date of his death is not known.
