

## EVANS, DAVID (1842 - 1914), Congregational minister

Born 15 January 1842 in Penybont-fawr, Montgomeryshire. He worked in his father's factory for a while. He was one of those who were influenced by the religious revival of 1859. After he had started preaching in Llanfyllin he went to a school in London, where his brother [Owen Evans](#) (1829 - 1920), was a Congregational minister, in order to prepare for the Independent college at Bala, where he spent the years 1860-3. He ministered at Rhosymedre, 1863-9, Barmouth and Cutiau 1870-2, Cymer (Rhondda) 1872-6, Pentre (Rhondda) 1876-82, and Lammas Street (Carmarthen) 1882-1907. For some years he edited *Y Dyddiadur Annibynnol*. He published *Cofiant y Gŵr Hynod*, *Cymeriadau Hynod*, and *Cymeriadau a Chymanfaoedd*. He died 22 March 1914. His brothers [Owen](#) and [Thomas Evans](#) (1844 - 1922) are separately noticed.
