Born in Denbighshire, 1670. He was educated at S. Omer College and was admitted a member of the society of Jesus, 2 February 1706-7. For some years he was professor of mathematics and philosophy at Liége and, from 1721-2 to 1728 was warden of S. Omer College. He is known to have written two books: *Anathemata Poetica Serenissimo Walliae Principi Jacobi regis, ... etc.* (S. Omer, 1688), and *Trigonometria plana et sphaerica, ... etc.* (Liége, 1704). He died at S. Omer 11 October 1730.
