He was a contemporary and friend of <u>Dafydd ap Gwilym</u>, who composed a *marwnad* upon him. From this poem we gather that he was a native of Powys Wenwynwyn and was killed by a friend's sword at Dolgelley, where he lies buried. For his poetry see <u>Jones</u> and <u>Lewis</u>, *Mynegai*, and Brogyntyn MS. 2 in the National Library of Wales. Rhetorical compositions attributed to him and entitled 'Breuddwyd Gruffudd ab Adda ap Dafydd,' and 'Trwstaneiddiwch Gruffudd ab Adda ap Dafydd,' have been published by <u>D. Gwenallt Jones</u> in his *Areithiau Prôs*, 18, 33. A musical composition under the title 'Caingc Ruffudd ab Adda' appears in *The Myvyrian Archaiology of Wales*.
