son of John Howell (died 1841) and his wife Gwen, of Tor-foel, Penderyn, Brecknock. He had little schooling, being apprenticed at eight years old to a shoe-maker; five years afterwards he went to work at Pont-Neath-Vaughan. When fourteen, he was at Merthyr Tydfil, a town of poets and musicians and of eisteddfodau; thence he moved to Aberdare, where he attended night-schools kept by John Anthony and [Dan Isaac Davies](#). He gave up shoe-making, and from 1854 till 1861 worked with his brother-in-law as a sawyer. But on the advice of his pastor [Thomas Price](#) (1820 - 1888) he became a printer, opening works of his own in 1867. His frequent contributions to the press won him repute in all parts of Wales - much poetry of his appeared in *Yr Ymfynydd*, *Seren Gomer*, and *Y Geninen*. He himself printed many Welsh books, besides the newspaper *Y Gweithiwr Cymreig* which he owned and edited. He was an authority on the folklore and the dialect of eastern Glamorgan, and at the Pontypridd national eisteddfod of 1893 he shared with [T. C. Evans](#) the prize for an essay on 'Glamorgan Folklore.' Two years before his death, he began a series of articles, in *Y Geninen*, on the older history of the Aberdare Valley. He died 14 June 1902, and was buried at Penderyn.
