Some of his poems survive in manuscripts, and these include a *cywydd* addressed to <u>Thomas Glyn</u>, Glynllifon, requesting a fishing boat from him, a *cywydd* to old age, and a more unusual kind of *cywydd* - an elegy on the death of his favourite hound, called Bwrdi. A bardic controversy between him and Rhydderch ap Rhisiart is also found. His poems are found in the following manuscripts - Bodewryd MS. 2; Glyn Davies MS. 1; <u>Llanstephan MS 118 7</u>, <u>Llanstephan MS 125 7</u>; Mostyn MS. 160; N.L.W. MSS. 832, 9166. A *cywydd* of praise to him, composed by <u>Dafydd Alaw</u>, is found in Peniarth MS. 63 (132).
