

HUW ap RHYS WYN (fl. c. 1550), poet

Member of the landed family of Mysoglen, Llangeinwen, Anglesey; husband of Catherine, daughter of Lewys ab Owain ap Meurig of Y Frondeg, Llangaffo. Some of his poems survive in manuscripts, and these include a *cywydd* addressed to **Thomas Glyn**, Glynllifon, requesting a fishing boat from him, a *cywydd* to old age, and a more unusual kind of *cywydd* - an elegy on the death of his favourite hound, called Bwrddi. A bardic controversy between him and Rhydderch ap Rhisiart is also found. His poems are found in the following manuscripts - **Bodewryd MS 2B** ; Glyn Davies MS. 1; **Llanstephan MS 118** , **Llanstephan MS 125** ; **NLW MS 3056D** ; **NLW MS 832E** , **NLW MS 9166B** . A *cywydd* of praise to him, composed by **Dafydd Alaw**, is found in **Peniarth MS 63** (132).
