lived at Graienyn, Llangower, Meironnydd, and was also factor to the neighbouring estates of Fachddeiliog and <u>Rhiwedog</u>. He is an important link in the bardic tradition of Penllyn, for he was an instructor of bards, of whom the best known is <u>Robert William</u> (1744 - 1815) of Pandy in Tre-Rhiwedog. Some of his work has been printed in *Beirdd y Bala* (correct ' Robert Saunderson ' in the introductory note to ' William Saunderson ') and in *Cymru (O.M.E.)*, i, 108-10, 197-8; and more remains in manuscript at the National Library of Wales. He was buried 16 December 1802 at Llangower, aged eighty-eight.
