Some examples of his work, in strict metres, are preserved in manuscript, including poems of praise to Harri Wyn of Anglesey and Siôn Wyn Amhorys (Brogyntyn MS. 6 (157b); [Llanstephan MS 11](#) (21), an elegy to Richard Lloyd of Llannerch Fawr in Ll n ([Llanstephan MS 123](#) (114)), a poem seeking reconciliation with youth (N.L.W. MS. 783 (128)), another in reply to a poem by Robert Elis (Jes. Coll. MS. 16, ii (119)), and religious *englynion* composed on the earthquake of 1574 (Mostyn MS. 131 (279)).
