From the fact that the objects of his panegyrics and elegies were North Wales gentry it appears that the poet, too, was from that part of Wales though according to *Cambrian Biog.*, *Cymru (O.J)*, *Enwogion Cymru: a Biographical Dictionary of Eminent Welshmen* [↗](#), and *Blackwell* he was from Ewyas, Herefordshire. A number of his poems remain in manuscripts, including some to Hywel ap Siôn ap Dafydd ab Ithel Fychan of Bryn Cynddel, Siôn ap Hywel Fychan of Penllyn, *Sir Roger Salusbury* of Llewenni, *Pierce Salusbury* of Bachymbyd, *Pirs Griffith* of Penrhyn, Lewys Owain of Dolgelly, and Siôn ab Elis Eutun (Eyton) of Ruabon.
