MS. 16 (239) are six *englynion* composed by the bard when he was imprisoned in London (with other men from Ll n) in the time of trouble with the earl of Leicester over Forest of Snowdon lands, whilst in N.L.W. Glyn Davies MS. 2 (15) and Mostyn MS. 145 (203) is an elegy on John Smith, Caernarvon. Other examples (or copies) of his poems are in N.L.W. MS. 5272 (102); Mostyn MSS. 131 (50), 144 (466), 145 (641, 644, 738); Cardiff MS. 8 (255); Cwrtmawr MSS. 14 (69), 114 (277); Wynnstay MS. 6 (143); Brogyntyn MS. 4 (59, 63), etc. He must not be confused with <u>Huw Lleyn</u>.
