Two *cywyddau* by him survive in which he engages in mock controversy with <u>leuan (Ifan) Dylyniwr</u>, harpist; he also wrote an *englyn* urging the bards who came to Bodwrda to write to the 'Worthyes' on the partition in the T Canol at Bodwrda. It is fairly certain that he kept a family bard and a family harpist at his home. From the elegy upon him, composed by <u>Wiliam LI n</u> it would appear that he was buried on Bardsey Island. He was the father of the John Wyn ap Hugh who was accused, by one Morgan ab leuan, of piracy in and around Bardsey (c. 1567).
