IESTYN ap GWRGANT (fl. c. 1081-1093), last independent ruler of Glamorgan

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Son of Gwrgant ab Ithel. Little is known with certainty about him. Cardiff seems to have been his seat of government, but the extent of his territory is unknown. He cannot have become supreme in Glamorgan until 1081, when Caradog ap Gruffydd, who ruled Glamorgan from c. 1075, was slain. In 1080, lestyn was sufficiently insignificant to appear as a minor witness attesting a grant of land made to Llandaff by 'Caratocus rex morcannuc.' Yet before his death, he was important enough to violate the sanctity of Llandaff, an act for which lestyn had to atone by a grant of land. He founded the fifth royal tribe of Wales, and most of the noble families of Glamorgan claimed descent from him.

A famous story of Glamorgan, at least as old as the 15th century, associates the Norman conquest of Glamorgan with lestyn's name. It describes how lestyn, through his kinsman <u>Einion ap Collwyn</u>, a fugitive in England, secured Robert Fitzhamon's assistance against <u>Rhys ap Tewdwr</u>, whom he slew at Penrhys. lestyn paid the Normans but refused <u>Einion</u>'s promised reward — his daughter in marriage. <u>Einion</u> recalled the departing Normans, who overthrew lestyn, divided the lowlands amongst themselves, leaving only the hill country to the Welsh. lestyn fled — to Keynsham Abbey, according to one version — where he died. Where this story touches known facts it is demonstrably wrong, e.g. Keynsham Abbey was not founded till 1169, while <u>Rhys</u> was slain near Brecon in Easter week 1093.
