who sang in the second half of the 15th century. Two *cywyddau* by him survive, the one upon the marriage-feast of <u>Sir Rhys ap Thomas</u> and Sioned (Janet), daughter of <u>Thomas Mathew</u> of Radyr, Glamorganshire, and the other to the 'paderau main crisial' (the crystal paternosters). There is a reference to him in a *cywydd* which <u>Llywelyn Goch y Dant</u> wrote c. 1470 to invite <u>Hywel ap Dafydd ap Ieuan ap Rhys</u> to visit Tir Iarll and the district; in them he is described as a man 'o Lyn Rhoddne Wlad' - the first bard from that valley, as far as is known. The *cywydd* on the paternosters shows that he possessed considerable descriptive skill.
