John Lewis was the author of *Brief Observations on the History of Modern Enthusiasm*, 1759. He translated into Welsh J. Crooksworth's *Principles of Truth*, under the title *Egwyddorion o'r Gwirionedd* (Carmarthen 1773). He exercised considerable influence upon the Welsh Quakers of his day in Pembrokeshire.
