son of Arthur Lewis of Fron, Brymbo, Denbighshire. He was one of the founders of the church in Adwy'r Clawdd and it was to his house that [Peter Williams](#) fled after his persecution in 1748. He began to exhort c. 1750. In 1751 he adhered to the party of [Howel Harris](#), but soon repudiated him and refused to join his 'Family' at Trevecka. He became an Antinomian and established a small following in the Clwyd valley and in Caernarvonshire. He is named with [Thomas Sheen](#), [Thomas Meredith](#), and other prominent Antinomians, and in 1763 was referred to as one who preached the doctrines of the [Relly](#) brothers. Towards the end of his life he abandoned religion altogether; he died an 'old man' c. 1800.
