A number of his poems remain in MSS., and these include *cywyddau* addressed to <u>William Mostyn</u> of Mostyn, <u>Pierce Mostyn</u> of Talacre, <u>William Holland</u> of Hendre fawr, and an *awdl* to <u>Thomas Pryse</u> of S. Asaph; two religious poems, one of them being anti-Papist in treatment, also remain.
