His *cywydd* to leuan Gwyn ap Gwilym Fwyaf shows that he was a native of Loughor, but he was known as 'Llawdden of Machynlleth.' Most of his poems were written to the families of <u>Thomas ap Rosier</u> of Hergest, and Phylip ap Rhys and Maredudd Fychan of Maelienydd. In the Carmarthen Eisteddfod of 1451 he is known to have accused <u>Gruffudd ap Nicolas</u> of being bribed to give the chair to <u>Dafydd ab Edmwnd</u>. His works are to be found in the MSS. of the 16th and 17th century. His burial place is traditionally believed to be Llanuwchllyn.
