A number of his poems remain in MSS., including an elegy composed to his son Gruffudd, 'begging' poems requesting a dog, some goats, and spectacles, a satire or lampoon addressed to the dean of Bangor (who had instructed Huw Lewis, Y Chwaen, to imprison the poet, rather than allow him to make a 'begging' journey or *cymortha* in Bodeon and Aberdaron), and another satire to [dean Richard Kyffin](#), [Rhys Pennardd](#), [Hywel ap Rheinallt](#), and [Lewis Môn](#). *Ymrysonau*, or bardic controversies, occurred between him and the following poets : [D. Llwyd](#) of Mathafarn, [Guto'r Glyn](#), [Lewys Môn](#), and Gruffudd ab Ieuan ap Rhys Llwyd.
