christened at S. Mary's, Cardigan, 1 November 1790, second son of James Meadows. His career is not recorded until 1823 when he was responsible for some of the illustrations in *The Mirror of the Stage*, and the lithographs used in Planché's *Costume of Shakespere's Historical Tragedy of King John*. He achieved popularity with *The Heads of the People or Portraits of the English*, 1838-40, to which W. M. Thackeray contributed. Meadows put out an illustrated edition of Shakespeare's works, 1839-43; he also illustrated many of the Christmas numbers of the *Illustrated London News*. He married the daughter of John Hennings, the sculptor, and was friendly with the leading writers of his day. He died 19 August 1874.
