

MORGAN, WILLIAM (Gwilym Gelli-deg; 1808 - 1878), poet

Born at Carmarthen, but spent the greater part of his life in the hamlet of Gelli-deg, near Merthyr Tydfil. He worked as a miner in Rhymney, Dowlais, and Cyfarthfa.

He was admitted as 'bard' in the Abergavenny eisteddfod of 1837. A constant competitor in local eisteddfodau, he won several prizes for poems and as penillion singer; he also served as music adjudicator. Amongst his prize poems are 'Awdl Gweledigaeth Pedr' (Merthyr, 1836) and 'Cywydd o glod i Wenynen Gwent' (Merthyr, 1837). A selection from his works was published under the title of *Cerbyd Awen* (Merthyr Tydfil, 1846), whilst thousands of copies were sold, in fairs and taverns, of his ballad - 'Ple byddaf mhen can mlynedd?' He died, in poverty, 29 May 1878, and was buried in Cefn cemetery, near Merthyr Tydfil.
