He and his brother, Uchtryd, were the reputed sons of <u>Edwin ap Gronw</u>, a great-great-grandson of <u>Hywel Dda</u> by Iwerydd, half-sister of <u>Bleddyn ap Cynfyn</u>. Though he assisted earl Hugh of Chester in the latter's abortive expedition against Gwynedd in 1098, his daughter, <u>Angharad</u>, married <u>Gruffudd ap Cynan</u>. His son, Gronw, was the father of <u>Christina</u>, second wife of <u>Owain Gwynedd</u>. He should not be confused with his father's cousin - also Owain ab Edwin - of the main royal line of Deheubarth.
