## PRICE, DAVID (fl. 1700-1742), Independent minister, and schoolmaster

Nothing is known about his early life but it is thought that he was educated at <u>Roger Griffith</u>'s Academy at Abergavenny. He was ordained minister of Maesyronnen church, Radnorshire, c. 1700. He lived at Llwyn-llwyd, in the parish of Llaneigon, Brecknock, where he kept a grammar school - <u>Hugh Evans</u> of Bristol and <u>Howel Harris</u> of Trevecka were among his pupils. In 1735 Carmarthen Academy was transferred to Llwynllwyd and <u>Vavasor Griffiths</u>, minister of the Independent church at Maes-gwyn, was appointed its principal. It is probable that the grammar school and the Academy were amalgamated and that the two teachers co-operated in carrying on the work. David Price died in August 1742.
