

PRICHARD, ROWLAND HUW (1812 - 1887), musician

Born 14 January 1812 at Y Graienyn, near Bala, a member of the family of [Rolant Huw](#), poet.

He laboured throughout his life in the cause of music and congregational singing. In 1844 he published *Cyfaill y Cantorion*, which contained about forty hymn-tunes, most of them composed by himself, and including the well-known 'Hyfrydol,' which he wrote when he was 20. He also published *Y Fasged Gerddorol, sef crynodeb o egwyddorion Cerddoriaeth*. Hymn-tunes and anthems by him appeared in *Haleliwia*, 1849; *Haleliwia Drachefn*, 1855; *Llyfr Emytau a Thonau* ([Stephen](#) and [Jones](#)); and other collections. He moved to Holywell in 1880 to serve as an official under the Welsh Flannel Manufacturing Company.

He died 25 January 1887, and was buried in St. Peter's church, Holywell.
