Born at Dolgelley in 1749, youngest son of Hugh and Jane Pugh - he was, therefore, brother to <u>David Pugh</u> and <u>John Pugh</u> (1744 - 1799). He was at Dr. Conant's School in Truro, Cornwall, before he went, in 1768, to Exeter College, Oxford; he graduated in 1772. He was curate at Neston and perpetual curate of Lee Brockhurst, Salop, before he became vicar of Donnington, Lincs. (1794-1825). He is named frequently in the letters of <u>Thomas Charles</u> of Bala; he tried to persuade <u>Charles</u> not to leave the Church. As one of the executors of the will of his brother <u>John</u> he was able to comply with the applications of <u>Thomas Charles</u> for support for his Sunday schools and the British and Foreign Bible Society. He died 16 February 1825.
