His canon has not been fixed, and there are textual confusions. In the *B.B.C.S.*, vol. i, part 2, 123-33, <u>Dr. Henry Lewis</u> published a study of the poems attributed to him in the *R. B. H. Poetry* and in *The Myvyrian Archaiology of Wales* Rhisierdyn sang panegyric *awdlau* to Gronwy (Fychan) ap Tudur (died 1382; see Ednyfed Fychan) and to Myfanwy his wife, and an elegiac *awdl* to <u>Sir Hywel y Fwyall</u>. The *awdl* to the abbot of Aberconwy which *The Myvyrian Archaiology of Wales* Attributes to <u>Casnodyn</u> is given in N.L.W. MS. 4973C 260b to Rhisierdyn, and Pen. MS. 118 (140) attributes to Rhisierdyn the pious ode 'y Duw uchaf y Kyfarchaf ... 'which is ascribed in *R. B. H. Poetry* (col. 1251) to <u>Bleddyn Ddu</u>. Many manuscripts (e.g. Bodl. 1 and 2, Pen. 90 and 100) include a panegyric *cywydd* to Hwlcyn ap Howel ap Ierwerth Ddu of Presaddfed, Anglesey ('Cad ddirwy keidw ddwyrodd'), which they attribute to Rhisierdyn. A pilgrimage by Hwlcyn to Jerusalem is mentioned in this poem.
