He sang the praises of <u>Tudur ap Goronwy</u> of Trecastell and Penmynydd (died 1367), and an elegiac *awdl* on his fellow Anglesey poet, <u>lorwerth ab y Cyriog</u>, who *fl*. around 1360. He also sang the praises of the wives of his patrons, such as Angharad, ' Dafydd's spouse.' His work has survived only in a confused state in the manuscripts. He was probably the father of the poet <u>Gwilym ap Sefnyn</u>.
