A native of Aberystwyth according to *Bye-Gones* (but an *englyn* in *Y Geninen* refers to him as a Merioneth man), but a native of Dolgellau, according to the *Welsh Gazette* and *Cambrian News*, he was for a time foreman in the *Cambrian News* printing works, Aberystwyth. Afterwards he was for over twenty years on the staff of the *Western Mail*, Cardiff, first as a day overseer and later as editor of the *Weekly Mail*. He wrote much on Welsh affairs and was regarded in his day as a champion of the Welsh language. He died at Aberystwyth, 15 June 1906.
