Born at Llanwenog, Cardiganshire. When 5 years old he lost his sight, but despite this handicap he became a proficient violinist and used to earn his living by playing at parties and other functions. He was also a good poet and was taught the poetic art by <a href="David Lloyd">David Lloyd</a>, Brynllefrith (1724 - 1779); Siôn Llwyd, grandfather of <a href="David Lloyd Isaac">David Lloyd</a>, acted as his scribe. He wrote in both English and Welsh, and two of his poems - 'Cynghor i Fab leuanc 'and 'Hanes Cyflwr Dyn yn mhob rhan o'i oes '-appeared in <a href="John Howell">John Howell</a>'s (Ioan Howell) <a href="Blodau Dyfed">Blodau Dyfed</a>, 1824. He died at Llanwenog, 4 March 1796.
