Born 1757 at Allt-ddu in the parish of Llannor, Caernarfonshire, and christened 10 July 1757. He became a weaver, seaman, and schoolmaster; at one time he served in a customs office in Liverpool. He spent the greater part of his life at Penfforddwen in the parish of Nantglyn, Denbighshire; he afterwards lived in Llwynbidwal, Bryneglwys, in the same county. He acquired some proficiency in astronomy and prepared some almanacks. He published (a) *Urania, neu Grefydd Ddadleuon*, 1793 - a species of interlude; (b) *Annerch leuengtyd Gymru, yn IV Rhan*, 1795 (with two later eds.); (c) *Telyn Arian, sef Llyfr Barddoniaeth*, c. 1800 (and about six subsequent eds.); (d) *Nabl Arian, sef Llyfr Barddoniaeth*, 1827. He died at Overton, Flintshire, 2 January 1835, and was buried there.
