

THOMAS, JOSHUA (died 1759?), cleric and translator

Born at Penpes in the parish of Llanlleonfel, Brecknock. He was curate at Tir yr Abad, Brecknock, in 1739, became vicar of Merthyr Cynog in 1741 and from 1746 held the living of Llanbister, Radnorshire, in addition; in 1758 he became vicar of Kerry, Montgomeryshire. He published *Undeb mewn Gwlad, neu Bregeth Ynghylch y Newidiad Diweddar a wnaed yn y Flwyddyn* (Shrewsbury, 1753?) - a sermon explaining the significance of the change of reckoning time (in 1752) from 'Old Style' to 'New Style.' He had previously published *Y Fuchedd Gris'nogol, o'i Dechreu, i'w Diwedd mewn Gogoniant ... gan Joan Scott, D.D., Person S. Giles yn y Meusydd yn Llundain. A Chyfieithad Josua Thomas, Ficer Llanbister yn Sir Faesyfed, a Merthyr Cynog ym Mrycheiniog, a Chaplain i'r Gwir Anrhydeddus Iarll Powis* (London, John Oliver, 1752).
