Among his few extant poems there is an elegy on the death of Llywelyn ap Ieuan ap Hywel (died 1534) of Moelyrch recorded in the manuscript of *cywyddau* compiled at Llywelyn's home (Pen. MS. 103, 17). He was one of the poets who wrote an elegy on the death of Rhys Llwyd ab Einion Fychan of Gydros, and Angharad his wife (Mostyn MS. 148, 128). He also addressed a soliciting poem to Robert Wyn ap Morus of Abertanad ([Llanstephan MS 125](#) , Llanstephan MS 265). According to Pen. MSS. 122, 123, he was buried at Oswestry.
