

WILLIAMS, THOMAS LLOYD (1830 - 1910), Welsh-American writer

Born 25 November 1830 at Brongaled, Dyffryn Ardudwy, Merionethshire. He came under the influence of the [Rev. Richard Humphreys](#) and the [Rev. Edward Morgan](#). He served in a shop for a while before he emigrated to Racine, Wisconsin, U.S.A., in 1850; there he opened a shop and worked in a woollen factory. He contributed to *Y Drych* and other journals. He published *A brief history of the early Welsh settlers of Racine and of the first Welsh C.M. Church from its organisation in 1842*, 1891, and *Cymry Racine, Wisconsin; Nodweddion y Genedl Gymreig*, 1904. In 1856 he wrote an essay 'Cymwysterau Gwladwr Da yn y Talaethau Unedig.' He died 24 November 1910.
