Known in his day as the author of a Welsh translation - *Caban 'Newyrth Tom* (Abertawy, 1853) - of Harriett B. Stowe's *Uncle Tom's Cabin*. He also published an attack on Mormonism under the title *Dynoethiad Mormoniaeth; yn cynwys Hanes Joseph Smith, Saith Gradd y Deml, Gwreigiaeth Ysbrydol, yn nghyda'r Seremoniau a arferir ar Dderbyniad i'r Urdd hono* (Abertawy, 1853). He was living at Ystradgynlais in 1853.

See now the note by E. Wyn James in *Canu Gwerin*, 27 (2004), p.46 (n.27), which shows that [Thomas Levi](#) was the author of the two volumes published under the pseudonym 'Y Lefiad'. The Methodist minister [William Williams](#) (1817-1900) contributed an introduction to [Thomas Levi](#)'s translation, *Crynodeb o Gaban 'Newyrth Tom* (1853).
