Son of <u>the Lord Rhys ap Gruffydd</u>. Nothing is known of him other than the impression he made on <u>Gerald the Welshman</u> when he was travelling through Ceredigion with Archbishop Baldwin preaching the crusade. <u>Gerald</u> says that he was a tall, handsome young man with fair curly hair, dressed in the style of Welshmen of the period - a shirt and a thin clock and barefooted - but lithe and dignified in appearance. He survived to old age but left no mark on the history of the period.
