

JONES, THOMAS ('Gogrynwr '; 1822 - 1854), doctor and musician

Born at Bronant, Dolgellau, Merionethshire, 1822. His father was a druggist who gave him the best education and apprenticed him to a surgeon. After completing his educational course and performing his hospital work successfully, he spent some time in Liverpool, and subsequently at Wrexham and Corwen. When he was 32 years old he moved to Penstryt, Llandegla, and died there in 1854. He left a manuscript volume of music containing tunes and the cantata *Gweddi Habacuc* which he had submitted to the Porthmadog *eisteddfod* in 1851. His letters which appeared in *Yr Amserau*, 1851, criticising the adjudication made by ' [Tanymarian](#) ' at Bethesda *eisteddfod*, led to much agitation in musical circles.
